## **SOAH Judge cancels hearing on GBRA Canyon Permit Amendment**

SEGUIN- Administrative Law Judge Mike Rogan of the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) today issued an order of “Dismissal of Action and Remand to Executive Director,” returning the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority’s (GBRA) Canyon Permit Amendment to the jurisdiction of the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC), said GBRA general manager W. E. “Bill” West, Jr.

Judge Rogan also cancelled the hearing on this matter, which was scheduled for tomorrow, July 19, 2001 at 10 a.m. in San Marcos, Texas. “The Judge requested that GBRA and the Executive Director of TNRCC undertake all feasible measures to notify persons who might have been interested in attending the July 19 hearing, and GBRA is requesting media representatives to assist us in this effort,” said West.

These actions were taken based on yesterday’s agreement between GBRA and Guadalupe River Trout Unlimited (GRTU). Under the agreement, GRTU unconditionally withdrew its request for a contested case hearing in this matter and both parties requested that it be remanded to the Executive Director of TNRCC for disposition as an uncontested matter.

Judge Rogan’s order states “Therefore, the Joint Motion for Remand submitted by GBRA and GRTU is hereby GRANTED. The captioned matter is withdrawn and dismissed from the docket of SOAH and remanded to the Executive Director for disposition as an uncontested matter.”
