GBRA PROVIDES UPDATE ON LOCAL, CURRENT & FUTURE WATER PROJECTS

Officials tour Honey Creek, Hill Country environment untouched by growth, development

WHAT: Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority General Manager Bill West provides update on local current and future water projects followed by a tour of the Honey Creek State Natural Area. Elected officials from Comal County, Kendall County, Blanco County and Bexar County tour the 2,800-acre site owned by Texas Parks & Wildlife and managed cooperatively with the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS). NRCS will provide information and show results of scientific studies including rangeland regeneration, water quality & quantity research and weather research projects.

Visuals include photo opportunities for sections of the area not usually seen by the public due to the research studies. Sections of Honey Creek provide unusually lush and beautiful environment untouched by today's Hill Country growth and development.
