SEGUIN- The U. S. Army Corps of Engineers announced the Canyon Reservoir release rate was decreased from 500 cubic feet per second (cfs) to 300 cfs on Thursday, June 10. This release will remain at 300 cfs through Sunday, June 13.

The Canyon Reservoir elevation is currently 915.09 feet above mean sea level (msl) and the inflow at the Spring Branch gauge is 2,560 cfs.

The Corps of Engineers is responsible for managing releases of water from the Canyon Reservoir flood pool between elevations 909 and 943 msl. When the reservoir is at or below 'conservation pool' elevation of 909 feet, the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) is responsible for managing the stored water portion and releases below 909 msl.

Canyon Dam and Reservoir was financed and completed in 1964 as a joint project by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and GBRA. It provides flood control benefits as well as a dependable water supply and operates under permits granted by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC).
