SEGUIN – The Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) Scholarship Program, which is part of the GBRA Employee Volunteer Program, awarded scholarships to area students from GBRA's ten county district. GBRA general manager W. E. "Bill" West, Jr. and Board chairman John P. Schneider, Jr. presented the scholarships at the Board of Directors regular meeting in Seguin on Wednesday, May 18.

Jason Eddleton, son of Johnny Eddleton and Edith Gibbons, was one of the seven recipients chosen to receive a \$2,000 scholarship.

Eddleton will graduate from Prairie Lea High School in Caldwell County where he was involved in VICA, DECA, the Spanish Club, Yearbook Staff, One-act Play, football, basketball, track and field, student government representative, Homecoming King and president of the Freshman, Sophomore and Junior classes.

Eddleton also performed many community service hours consisting of meals-on-wheels, and worked with Pathways, a first and second grade Bible study for community service.

Eddleton plans to attend Texas State University at San Marcos where he will major in accounting.

The GBRA Employee Volunteer Program was founded in December of 2000 and is led by a committee with a chairperson responsible for the overall program. Its purpose is to improve the quality of life in area communities through the commitment of GBRA employees and the use of their time, energy, talents and skills.
