**Boil Water Notice Lifted for Port O'Connor, Alamo Beach, Indianola and Magnolia Beach**  
***City of Port Lavaca and outlying rural water service areas remain under Boil Water Requirement pending final water test results***

**As of noon Friday, June 16, residents of Port O'Connor and the communities of Alamo Beach, Indianola and Magnolia Beach no longer need to boil water for drinking, cooking or making ice.** The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has approved the samples submitted from these distribution systems and their water is now cleared for public consumption.

The announcement was made in a joint statement issued by officials of the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA), the City of Port Lavaca, the Calhoun County Rural Water Supply Corporation, and the Port O'Connor Municipal Utility District.

**However, residents in the City of Port Lavaca, and in the outlying rural water service areas in the general vicinity of the City, are asked to continue boiling water while tests are completed on a second water sample from the Port Lavaca distribution system.**

In order to return these water systems to full production, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) requires that water samples be collected, tested and approved for quality and safety within these distribution systems.

The boil water requirement has been in effect since Tuesday, June 13 following a break in a water pipe at the Port Lavaca Water Treatment Plant.

It is emphasized that the boil water notification is required by TCEQ regulatory authority and is a precautionary measure taken to ensure the public's safety.
