## **GBRA Lake Wood Recreation Area Hosts KIDFISH Event Saturday, September 22**

SEGUIN – The KIDFISH Foundation will stock 500 pounds of channel catfish in the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) Lake Wood Recreation Area for children to catch on Saturday, Sept. 22 from 9 a.m. to noon. Lake Wood is located near Gonzales, off U.S. Highway 90A at the end of FM 2091 South.

The event is free, no parking fees will be charged to participants and no pre-registration is required. Registration forms are available at local schools, the Lake Wood Recreation Area and on the day of the KIDFISH event. Bait, tackle and loaner rods will be provided to children who do not have their own equipment.

Sponsors helping to bring KIDFISH to the Gonzales community are GBRA and Guadalupe Valley Electric Cooperative (GVEC). Free boat rides, door prizes, including over 100 rod and reels, and free hot dogs will be provided by Zebco, American Rodsmiths, Ruben Gomez of Bass Pro Shop in San Antonio, Jason and John Gallas, Ronnie Logan of Skeeter Boats from Anchor Marine, Rick Shock with Nitro Boats, Ron's Tropical Sno and J-Rock Homes, LLL. It is not necessary to bring a donation to participate. Donations go toward expanding the KIDFISH program. All children will receive a goody bag, KIDFISH ribbon and a diploma. The longest fish winners and first-and second-place winners in each group will receive a trophy.

Participants in this event can qualify for the 2007 KIDFISH Classic. Qualifiers for the classic will be the top fundraisers over \$50, the children catching the longest fish in their age group, and any child fundraising \$100 or more. The Classic will feature unforgettable fishing for trophy catfish up to 30 pounds. First prize will be a \$1,000 savings bond for the child and \$1,000 cash for the child's school.

KIDFISH is a non-profit outreach program designed to give children age 16 and under the chance to experience the sport of fishing and the outdoors. Participants are encouraged to collect sponsorships from friends, relatives and neighbors to win a variety of prizes. A minimum of \$10 will allow participants to receive awards such as t-shirts, hats, trophies and medals.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
