Lake Dunlap to be lowered August 10 thru August 29

SEGUIN--- Beginning the evening of Sunday, Aug. 10, 2008, Lake Dunlap will be lowered approximately 18 to 24 inches below normal so that Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) hydroelectric crews can perform routine maintenance to the dam.

Lake Dunlap will be raised 6-8 inches, for weekend use beginning Friday evenings, Aug. 15 and 22 and lowered again Sunday evenings, Aug. 17 and 24. This schedule will continue for the duration of the routine dam maintenance.

GBRA officials are advising that these scheduled operations may be completed before August 29, 2008, or may need to be extended for an additional period of time. Operations also may be adjusted or canceled in the event of adverse weather conditions. GBRA also advises anyone using Lake Dunlap for recreation purposes during this time to exercise caution. Lower lake levels may expose debris and other potential hazards that are normally underwater. The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
