Lake Dunlap to be raised for Labor Day Holiday

Routine Dam Maintenance to Resume Sept. 1

SEGUIN----Beginning the evening of Friday, Aug. 29, Lake Dunlap's level will start to refill and will return to its normal level by noon Saturday, Aug. 30 for the Labor Day weekend.

On Monday, Sept. 1, Lake Dunlap will be lowered approximately 18 to 24 inches below normal so that Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) hydroelectric crews can perform routine maintenance to the dam.

Lake Dunlap will be raised 6-8 inches, for weekend use beginning Friday evenings Sept. 5 and 12 and lowered on Sunday evenings, Sept. 7 and 14. This schedule will continue for the duration of the routine dam maintenance.

GBRA officials are advising that these scheduled operations may be completed before Sept. 19, 2008, or may need to be extended for an additional period of time. Operations also may be adjusted or canceled in the event of adverse weather conditions. GBRA officials advise anyone using Lake Dunlap for recreational purposes during this time to exercise caution. Lower lake levels may expose debris and other potential hazards that are normally underwater. For questions about Lake Dunlap levels during maintenance, please call GBRA (830) 379-5822 ext. 241.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
