SEGUIN-The Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority and Caldwell County will hold the final stakeholders meeting for the Caldwell County Regional Water and Wastewater Planning Study on Monday, August 3, 2009 at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be held in the Caldwell County Annex, located at 1403B Blackjack Street (FM 20 East) in Lockhart.

The objective of the meeting is to present the findings of the regional planning study to the area stakeholders. The study was performed by Klotz Associates and funded by the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB), the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) and Caldwell County. All residents of Caldwell County are considered stakeholders and are invited to attend. The draft final report will be available to download on the GBRA webpage at www.gbra.org after Friday, July 24, 2009. The purpose of the planning study is to assess future water and wastewater needs for Caldwell County and develop plans to meet those needs. The current dry conditions in Central Texas illustrate and reinforce the need for proactive regional water resource planning and development.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
