Lake Dunlap Lowering to be Extended thru May 28 to Continue Routine Dam Maintenance

SEGUIN----Because of rainfall events below and above Canyon Reservoir and changes in release rates at Canyon Reservoir by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority is extending the lowering of Lake Dunlap to allow hydroelectric crews to perform maintenance on the dam. Lake Dunlap will continue to be 18-24 inches below normal through approximately May 28.

GBRA officials are advising that these scheduled operations may be completed before May 28 or may need to be extended for an additional period of time. Operations also may be adjusted or canceled in the event of high flows or adverse weather conditions. GBRA officials advise anyone using Lake Dunlap for recreational purposes during this time to exercise caution. Lower lake levels may expose debris and other potential hazards that are normally underwater. For questions about Lake Dunlap levels during maintenance, please call GBRA (830) 379-5822.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
