Restrictions Eased on Lake McQueeney

SEGUIN, TX-The Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority General Manager William "Bill" E. West has modified the restrictions of certain watercraft on Lake McQueeney effective today. Restrictions imposed on the remaining hydro lakes: Lake Dunlap, Lake Placid, Lake Nolte (Meadow Lake), Lake H-4 (Lake Gonzales), and Lake Wood (Lake H-5) REMAIN IN EFFECT.

Beginning today, GBRA officials are permitting the use of motorized boats only - with no towing of objects or individuals - in designated areas of Lake McQueeney where cleanup has occurred. The temporary suspension of the restrictions for Lake McQueeney is indefinite and may be extended or terminated by action of GBRA. All other restrictions on Lake McQueeney and the other hydro lakes continue to apply. Individuals who would like to access the hydro lakes to retrieve or secure personal property may continue to contact GBRA's Yolanda Pierce at ypierce@gbra.org to obtain a permit.

The cleanup of Lake McQueeney is underway and being funded by Friends of Lake McQueeney (FOLM). In addition to FOLM, entities coordinating the inspection of the cleanup include crews with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority.

Upon completion of the cleanup, GBRA officials will post notice via press release on the GBRA website when other watercraft and recreational activities may be allowed.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
