Lake Dunlap to be Lowered April 25-29 for Routine Dam Inspection

SEGUIN---Beginning Monday, April 25, Lake Dunlap's level will be lowered approximately 18 to 24 inches below normal so that Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) hydroelectric maintenance crews can perform an inspection of the dam.

GBRA officials are advising that these scheduled operations may be completed before April 29, or may need to be extended for an additional period of time. Operations also may be adjusted or canceled in the event of adverse weather conditions.

GBRA officials advise anyone using Lake Dunlap for recreational purposes during this time to exercise caution. Lower lake levels may expose debris and other potential hazards that normally are underwater. For questions about Lake Dunlap levels during maintenance, please call GBRA (830) 379-5822.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
