



## Four Canyon Lake Boat Ramps Continue Operation Despite Drought

CANYON LAKE, TX-Comal County officials reported this week that four boat ramps remain usable at Canyon Lake, but noted that five other ramps were closed. Despite the drought and falling lake level, recreationalists may use ramp numbers 1, 2, 6 and 8.

The current lake level is 901.30 mean sea level (msl). Listed below is the status of county boat ramps on Canyon Lake along with each ramp's estimated closure elevation.
