Modifications to Lake Dunlap Dam Repair Schedule

SEGUIN — In mid-August, the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) hydroelectric crews lowered the level of Lake Dunlap for contracted repair work on the dam, which was to continue for an approximate 60- to 90-day period. Recently, the contractor submitted a change order that will affect the initial schedule developed for completion of the repairs .

Allen Ognoskie, GBRA's division manager - Guadalupe/Gonzales counties, said unexpected conditions and repairs related thereto led to the contractor's actions. The level of Lake Dunlap will remain low through at least the end of the year.

GBRA staff will continue to meet with the contractor about these matters next week to determine a revised schedule for completing the repairs. GBRA will communicate the new completion date with Lake Dunlap and local constituents .
