## Level of Lake Dunlap to Be Raised Temporarily

Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) hydro crews will begin to raise the level of Lake Dunlap beginning Friday, Mar. 9, 2012, and the lake is expected to reach its normal elevation by late Sunday, Mar. 11.

GBRA crews had been working to complete the gate work necessary on the dam that would allow filling the lake for a temporary period of time.

"The combination of the recent forecast indicating inclement weather and the crew having reached a point in repairs where we could safely raise the lake level created an opportunity where we could temporarily suspend repairs, and doing so potentially would allow some recreation with minimal inconvenience," Jeff McKee, GBRA's assistant division manager for Hydroelectric and Rural Utilities, said, explaining that this work hiatus means that the completion date for dam repairs will be moved from the end of March to sometime around the first part of April.

Hydro crews will begin lowering the lake on Sunday, Mar. 18, in order to resume dam repairs on Monday, Mar. 19.
