Level of Lake Dunlap to Be Raised

Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) hydro crews will begin to raise the level of Lake Dunlap beginning Thursday, April 5, 2012, and the lake is expected to reach its normal elevation by Friday, April 6.

GBRA crews have been working to complete the gate work necessary on the dam that would allow filling the lake.

In a related matter, GBRA General Manager, Bill West has expanded the Lake Dunlap Temporary Committee on Lake Usage to include additional representation from Lake Dunlap, and the first meeting of the committee will take place next week.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
