Meadow Lake to be Lowered for Maintenance

SEGUIN, TX---Beginning, Sunday, April 29, 2012 Lake Nolte (Meadow Lake) will be lowered approximately 18 inches so that Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) hydroelectric crews can perform routine maintenance.

The work is expected to be completed by Friday, May 4, and the lake level will be raised to its normal level by Saturday, May 5.

GBRA advises anyone using the lake for recreation purposes during this time to exercise caution, because lower lake levels may expose debris and other potential hazards that are normally underwater.

Operations also may be adjusted or canceled in the event of adverse weather conditions.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
