## **GBRA Initiates Stage I Drought Measures for Luling and Lockhart**

SEGUIN, TX — Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) officials on Monday announced Stage I drought measures for the cities of Luling and Lockhart as part of the “mild water shortage condition” of the GBRA Drought Contingency Plan . The plant supplies drinking water to the cities of Luling and Lockhart. The San Marcos River is the water source for the water treatment plant.

Under the plan, GBRA requests the cities of Luling and Lockhart to work toward reducing water demand from the treatment plant by 5 percent and initiate the respective stage of its drought management plan to reduce water use.

Daily average flow Sunday, May 4 at the USGS gauge located in Luling recently fell to 128 cubic feet per second (cfs). It has been below 130 cfs for the past several days.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
