GBRA's Coletto Creek Park Offers Summer Kids Fishing Classes

SEGUIN— Children's fishing classes will be offered on May 24, June 21, and July 19 from noon until 2:00 p.m. at GBRA's Coletto Creek Park, located between Goliad and Victoria off of Highway 59.

GBRA's Coletto Creek Park, which is a participating partner in the "Nature Rocks - South Texas" network, a part of the "Texas Children in Nature" initiative, is offering classes to help encourage families to spend more time outdoors this summer, and to help prepare those children wanting to participate in GBRA's Coletto Creek Annual Kid's Fishing Tournament to be held June 7.

Classes will be open to children ages 8-14. There is no charge for the classes but pre-registration is required to ensure enough materials for all participants. Each class is limited to a total of 10 participants. A certified Texas Parks and Wildlife Department instructor will teach each class the basics of fishing. All equipment will be provided, but participants are strongly advised to bring drinking water and sun protection. This class will be held outdoors.
