Submitted photos must have been taken at the Coletto Creek Park and Reservoir, and photos will be judged by a committee consisting of members from the Victoria Photo Club. Winning entries will be displayed at Coletto Creek Park's Headquarters for the rest of 2015.

The Adult Division will have a "Best of Show" winner. Other winners will be selected in the following categories: animals/fauna; landscapes/wildflowers; reptiles/amphibians; birds/insects; creative; and people/recreation activities. Some photographers may participate in a separate "General Student Division." The best of show and first place winners in each category will each receive a cash prize of \$50 plus an award certificate. First place in the student category will receive a \$30 cash prize and award certificate.

By submitting photos to this contest, the photographer agrees to allow the Guadalupe- Blanco River Authority's Coletto Creek Park to use and publish entered photos without further compensation to the photographer. The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district.
