Crews to Raise Levels at Lakes Dunlap and Placid

SEGUIN, TX — The Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority's (GBRA) hydroelectric crew members will begin raising the levels of lakes Dunlap and Placid (TP-4) beginning **Friday, May 22, 2015**.

Crews plan to return the level at Lake Placid to its normal elevation beginning Friday evening and it should reach the normal elevation during the morning of Saturday, May 23.

While the level at Lake Dunlap will be raised to its crest, the lake will remain about 6 inches lower than its normal elevation. "Because more rainfall is expected during the Memorial Day weekend, hydro crews want to leave some room for potentially higher flows, which may allow for a faster response in the event of a flood situation," said Allen Ognoskie, division manager for Guadalupe/Gonzales Counties, Guadalupe Valley Hydroelectric Division. Crews anticipate Lake Dunlap will reach crest elevation around mid-day Friday.
