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GBRA Coletto Creek Park Offering Summer Programs for Kids and Families

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COLETO CREEK - Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority's Coletto Creek Park, located at 365 Coletto Park Road, between Victoria and Goliad on Highway 59, is offering a kids fishing class and guided nature hikes this summer .

The kids fishing class will be offered on May 30 at 4 p.m. at the park's fishing pier. The class is open to children ages 8 to 14. There is no charge for the class but pre-registration is required to ensure enough materials are available for all participants. Contact the park office at 361-575-6366 or coletto@gbra.org to register. A limit of 10 children may participate in the class to learn the basics of fishing by a Texas Parks and Wildlife Department certified instructor . All equipment will be provided, however participants will need to bring their own drinking water and sun protection for this outdoors class.

Guided Nature Hikes will be held every Saturday this summer until Aug. 1 at the Coletto Creek Park. The hikes will be led by Reservoir Ranger, Dan Beckendorf, and his wife, Anna. They will help participants identify plants and wildlife within the park's natural ecosystem. Pre-registration is not required for these hikes, but the normal day-use fee of \$9.00 per vehicle and/or any camping fees will apply if camping in the park. The hikes will begin at the Wildscape located by the park's Pavilion "C" .

GBRA Coletto Creek Park is a participating partner in the Nature Rocks-South Texas Network and part of the Texas Children in Nature initiative, offering programs to help encourage children to spend more time outdoors .
