All Drought Stages Rescinded on Area Hydroelectric Lakes

SEGUIN, TX — After significant rain fall in the Guadalupe River Basin, Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA) officials on Thursday announced all drought measures are being rescinded on area hydroelectric lakes in Comal, Guadalupe and Gonzales counties.

As of Thursday, June 4, the flow at Comal Springs was 311 cubic feet per second (cfs). Stage I drought measures for the hydro lakes are only triggered when Comal springflow drops below 250 cfs. The last time the hydro lakes were not affected by drought measures was in April 2012.

The GBRA was established by the Texas Legislature in 1933 as a water conservation and reclamation district. GBRA provides stewardship for the water resources in its 10-county statutory district, which begins near the headwaters of the Guadalupe and Blanco rivers, ends at San Antonio Bay, and includes Kendall, Comal, Hays, Caldwell, Guadalupe, Gonzales, DeWitt, Victoria, Calhoun, and Refugio counties.
