The National Weather Service has predicted tropical storm force winds along the mid-Texas Coast as early as late tonight (Aug 24, 2017). A hurricane warning is in effect from Port Mansfield to Matagorda. GBRA operations within Calhoun, Refugio, Golia and Victoria counties are located in the warning area. GBRA's office at Port Lavaca will be closed today as staff begin final preparations for this storm. Coletto Creek Park also will be closed today. Both offices will reopen after storm damages have been assessed and recovery efforts have been completed to make operations safe for both employees and customers.
