

Canyon Lake Release Advisory
Oct. 29, 2018

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) will reduce water releases to approximately 2,000 cubic feet per second (cfs) beginning Monday, Oct. 29, due to Canyon Lake's declining elevation.

Due to elevated inflows still coming into Canyon, USACE will continue to make flood releases until the reservoir elevations drops to 910'. Once the inflows have subsided and with the lake elevation lower, USACE will enable GBRA to release the remaining flood pool utilizing the Canyon Hydroelectric Generating Plant. When GBRA begins making releases, the flow downstream of Canyon Dam will be approximately 800 cfs or lower depending on inflows to reservoir measured at Spring Branch.

As USACE announces the timing, duration, and flow rate of releases from Canyon Dam, GBRA will forward the information. Releases from Canyon Dam are based on current inflows and rainfall.
